A total of 308,461 correct answers were submitted, a staggering 128,323 more than the school that was placed second. The National Autistic Society Fundraiser

Just before the half term, I received a lovely letter from a pupil in Year 6, Chloe. In her letter, she expressed that she would like to raise funds for a charity close to her heart: The National Autistic Society.
